Re: Condemning the recent actions of President Donald Trump

I am sure also that you will have seen the shocking scenes of excessive police force, using tear gas and rubber bullets, against often peaceful protestors in the US, actions incited by President Donald Trump.

The President has repeatedly threatened violence against protestors without offering any concessions to the very legitimate demands being made for racial justice. Just recently the President promised that any who scaled the White House fence would be met by the most 'vicious dogs' and 'ominous weapons'. I am sure you will agree with me that we must condemn the actions of President Trump and call on him to deescalate tensions, by altering his language and listening to the pleas of peaceful protestors. You will have no doubt seen the Leader of the Opposition, Sir Keir Starmer, calling on the Prime Minister to do similar.
